#### News from Year 6

It is lovely to say that we are settling into some normality in year 6 having had a baptism of fire in the form of baseline tests at the start of term. However, we are now getting stuck in to our learning. Ask the children what the subjunctive is and see if they can give you an example! We are also beginning an art project, looking at harvest jugs that are a local art form in North Devon using the Scraffito technique of scraping patterns through a layer of slip over the clay.

We will be creating representations of pots like these using harvest images. Our history topic this term is the Industrial Revolution and we shall be exploring life at that time and how the revolution was represented differently here in Devon to other parts of the country.
