


School Photographs

Relationships and Sex Education Policy

As of this term, every school is required to have a policy that lays out their approach to relationships and sex education. This is not 'the birds and the bees' but a whole programme setting out how we talk about relationships, how we ensure children learn to maintain healthy friendships and what to do when friendships go wrong, how different families can have different forms and how that's ok and so on. This policy does also say how we will teach about our changing bodies, about puberty and about how babies are made. The new policy doesn't indicate a change in practice, just a clarification of what we do.

I have emailed every parent and carer on my system with a copy of the draft policy and an invitation to a virtual meeting to consult on it. If you are unable to attend the meeting but have a comment to make do email me or drop a message in at reception. We will ensure that all voices are heard before we finalise and publish the policy.
